Mayor's Corner

Tonight, puts the close on Halloween and Thanksgiving and Christmas are coming fast. Our last year and a half have been one with many health challenges. We have lost some residences to the effects of this Covid Pandemic. We hope that you are all practicing good safety measures and seeing good results in that you have not been affected.

Several quick items.

- A ride through town after sundown, I discovered numerous street lights that were flickering or were not on at all. We are compiling a list to forward to Rocky Mountain Power to have them schedule maintenance.
- 2. With the recent rains and cooler weather, we have seen a marked reduction in water consumption. Our springs are coming up slightly, which they normally do this time of year, but not enough to turn off the pumps. The recent rains have provided great natural watering for our lawns. Please make sure your lawns are fertilized. A good fertilizing schedule will maintain a healthy lawn.
- 3. We are in a difficult market for finding a rental home to live in in Mayfield. We have noticed some have resorted to living in camping trailers. We do have an ordinance in the Mayfield Town Codes which limit using that option. One of the concerns is the proper connections to city culinary water and the proper disposal of waste. Dumping a trailer sewage into a non-approved cesspool is against state health codes and could result in a fine from the Central Utah Health Department.
- 4. In a recent town council meeting we had interest in a beautification committee. We are also interested in creating a committee to work on walking trails and working to improve areas to walk rather than on the city streets. If you are interested in helping with either of these committees, please let us know.
- 5. I hope that we all realize that we are all living in close proximity to each other and that our activities can impact our neighbors. If those activities create an unhealthy, unsafe, or unsanitary or toxic odor, you are violating others' rights.
- 6. We have looked at our town's celebration of Christmas. This past year we had a drive around float in lieu of the Christmas Eve Santa Claus coming around town. That was done due to the impact of the Covid Pandemic. We have had the benefits of the Covid Vaccines, but we are still struggling with the effects of the Delta Variant and the hospitals are still operating at or near capacity. We have in recent years had difficult times getting people to give up their Christmas eve to act as Santa Claus and spend all Christmas eve. We have opted to do a town celebration on December 18. We will have more information as plans finalize.

Thank you again for all your support. We have great citizens in town. I would also like to thank all our town employees and volunteers.
